

1.1 Aprire Writer

Per scrivere una lettera usando Writer di LibreOffice, occorre – naturalmente - aprire il programma. La Suite Libre Office consente di farlo utilizzando diverse modalità, ognuna più adatta in una particolare situazione:

- da desktop, con un doppio clic sull'icona di LibreOffice e scegliendo la voce Nuovo Documento qualora non si sia ancora aperto il programma e si abbia l'icona ben visibile
- passando da Start – Programmi e scegliendo la voce LibreOffice per poi selezionare voce Nuovo Documento nel caso in cui non si abbia una icona disponibile a desktop
- selezionando dal menù File la voce Apri e scegliendo Nuovo Documento nel caso in cui si sia provveduto ad aprire LibreOffice in precedenza
- per approfondire le caratteristiche delle singole modalità di apertura, si può consultare l'approfondimento “Nuovo Documento”.

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Umbrian schools teach Venice how to switch to open source

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The Italian region of Veneto should learn from the free and open source software experiences of schools in the Umbria region, says Enio Gemmo, IT consultant and member of LibreVeneto, a chapter of the LibreItalia community. The added benefit of using free software is that it promotes an open data culture, Gemmo says. However, he cautions that any switch to free and open source solutions and open data formats needs to be carefully prepared, and executed gradually.
